

# The Hull Handbells Project

Promoting Double Handed Change Ringing throughout East Yorkshire

## Touches of Plain Bob Minor

Touches are most often rung using the tenor bell as the reference point (a.k.a. an observation bell). It is perfectly acceptable to make calls that affect the tenor, but very often the tenor is unaffected. The calling positions are known by their impact on the tenor viz:

Plain Course work	Title	Code
Dodge 5-6 Up	Wrong	W
Dodge 3-4 up	Fourths	F
Make Seconds Place	Before	B
Dodge 3-4 Down	In	I
Dodge 5-6 Down	Home	H

When writing down touches in "shorthand" it is conventional to use a dash symbol to indicate a bob, and "S" to indicate a single, and generally course end change rows are given. In the touches below we have added the related coursing order as well, and the specific purpose touches are spelled out in more detail. We have used "B" for Bob and "S" for Single.

## Getting started with touches

The major factors seem to be:

The overall strength of the band,

The speed at which concepts and challenges are being tackled and overcome.

If you are lucky enough to have two experienced handbell ringers and only one "improver" in the touch then just working through the touches, watching for mistakes and learning points should be enough to get up to quarter peal standard.

If your situation is more of a struggle, the following are suggested:

Brief the band on what the touch entails, and specifically get the weaker person on the inside pair to learn how their bells are affected.

It can be useful for the conductor to call out when the lead ends occur that have no call.

Putting a weaker ringer on 5-6 and briefing him / her on the repeating pattern of the calls, and the repeating structure of the work of their pair of bells can enable progress to be made, and very importantly, practice to be gained by all concerned.

All touches are shown with tenor as the observation bell.

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## Short Touches of Plain Bob Minor

Whilst touches 1, 2 and 3 are often called using the patterns of bobs and singles, they should also be examined from the view of the observation bell and hence used as practice for following and observing the coursing order. Touches 11 through 14 converge with touch No 5 to give progressively longer touches up to 552 change rows.

This is the shortest possible touch, bells 5, 6 and 4 make the bobs in turn.

**Variation:** Call single instead of each of the first two bobs.

**Notes:** 1-2 never leave coursing position.

Composition 2 and 3 are further variations on composition 1.

**Notes:** In this simple touch bell No 4 makes both bobs, 5-6 run in and out at the first bob, and 2 and 3 run in and out at the second.

**Notes:** A bob every time the tenor dodges in 5-6.

Touch No. 5 has the 5<sup>th</sup> making the bob and running out twice for 120 changes length. This pattern is carried forward into touch No. 18 and repeated twice to make 360 changes; and to touch No. 19 where there are 5 repetitions to make a 720.

The touch is designed to ensure that No 2 makes 2nds, 3rds and 4ths at least once each at the call of single.

## Longer Touches of Plain Bob Minor

Touches 10 through to 14 build on and combine touches nos. 3 and 5 to give a variety of practice lengths and pair patterns, especially helpful for the aspiring conductor on 5-6.

The tenor is unaffected by calls but bell no 5 makes 4ths at each bob, and 3rds at each single. This is the building block of the following two touches.

### Hints and tips

This popular 720 has almost the minimum number of calls, and **one bell unaffected by the calls** at Wrong in each part, viz:

Part 1: Bells 5, 3, 2 affected by calls; 4, unaffected by calls, dodges 5-6 down with Tenor

Part 2: Bells 5, 2, 4 affected by calls; 3, unaffected by calls, dodges 5-6 down with Tenor

Part 3: Bells 5, 4, 3 affected by calls; 2, unaffected by calls, dodges 5-6 down with Tenor

Some **pitfalls** for the ringer of **3-4 to avoid**:

**1<sup>st</sup> part:** After the first bob and single, 3-4 are coursing, 3 down before 4.

**2<sup>nd</sup> part:** The halfway point is at the end of the course, coursing order 54236, and at the home, the change is 124356.

Bob Wrong Single Wrong completes the block and brings back coursing order 52436 until the part end.

**3<sup>rd</sup> part:** In this last part, 3-4 are coursing throughout. In the first and last course of the last part, the order is 4 down before 3; in the 2<sup>nd</sup> and 3<sup>rd</sup> courses, the order is 3 down before 4.

So for the last 5 courses of the extent, 3-4 are coursing: 2 courses 4 down first, 2 courses 3 down first, and 1 last course, 4 down first.

And one **pitfall for the conductor to avoid**:

The first bob Wrong of a part comes immediately after the last bob Home of the previous part.

Are you short of mental capacity to transpose coursing orders whilst ringing and calling at handbell speeds? - You bet!

So, **just learn the coursing orders**, viz:

At Wrong: B 325, S 523, B 235, S 532 plain course, Home B 5243 part end;

At Wrong: B 245, S 542 half way, B 425, S 524, Home B 543 2part end;

At Wrong: B 435, S 534, B 345, S 543, Home B 5324 720 end.

**Notes:** A bob is called every time the tenor dodges in 5-6 except when it dodges with 5.

5 rings to a consistent pattern, make the bob, run out twice.

The two singles can be called in various places, but must be called in the same place in each part. The simple variations are:

Single instead of the bob wrong in either the 1st, or the 3rd, or the 5<sup>th</sup> course.

Single at home in either the 2nd, or the 4th, or the 6th course.

## 24 540 Plain Bob Minor –

**Call composition 23 omitting one block of 4 calls at Wrong.**

### Caveat

At first sight touches 16 and 23 are very similar each having a round block of 4 calls at wrong.

This is deceptive.

Touch 15 contains a repeated structure with 5-6 ringing two courses coursing, and 2 courses parted. Touch 20 has 5-6 coursing for 1 course and parted for 3. The extensions to 720 are then fundamentally different with touch 15 becoming a 3 part calling at touch 16, and touch 20 requiring 2 extra courses including a single to produce a 2 part 720.

**The temptation to confuse the two approaches and call either BSBS Wrong BSB Home or SBSBW BH should be avoided as the touches are false.**
